New Mexico: Eddy Co. Guadalupe Mountains

October 25, 2015

My family is on a deer hunt in the Guadalupe's this weekend. We are camped at the first pullout to the east off the Queen highway out of Last Chance Canyon, as the road enters the climb into the hills. This is a canyon - east/west facing & in limestone foothills in the pinyon/juniper /sumac /scrub oak zone, with ^{+ Madrone} _(state lands) ^{on N facing} _{slope} ^{on S facing} _{slope}. Acacia, Ocotillo, Lechuguilla, Basellion, Yucca, Aloysia etc. on south facing slopes. This canyon (north facing side) has been burned in ~ 4-5 years ago, but the juniper + oak are resprouting from stumps. South-facing slope not burned - road into canyon acted as fire break. The road goes many miles east, with spin offs to south following the rim above the X-Bar Ranch.

Oct 23

Got to camp ~ 1:30 pm & spent afternoon setting up. Clear & warm after heavy rains previous week. Very lush grass & vegetation - this is the second year in row of good rainfall. Saw 2 does & 1 ^{male deer} _{young buck} around camp in early eve; pair of Barn owls calling in harmony in evening. Moon at 3/4, waxing. Temp dropped overnight, clouds came in early a.m.

on way back. Gradually a bit warmer
& clearer after lunch.

I set two lines of Sherman traps
by camp: ~ p.m. Captured previous page
& above for 25 Oct. Line 1 = on N facing
slope / ^{rocky} upland area above & just east
of camp, in juniper, oaks, & Madrone.
mostly not burned - dense shrub.

Line 2: Set below camp in grassy
open area along canyon bottom / next
to arroyo in burned juniper / sumac/
Acacia and unburned juniper -

Total traps out: 65 Shermans

Set ~ 10 paces, non-linear, oats + peanut
butter bait, w/cotton pads for cold.
