APRIL 19 Wednesday AGIABAMPO, SONORA, MEXICO.

This morning hunted along the beach and the mangrove patch and aboutthe ranch. Saw the following birds not seen yesterday. A large flock of White Pelicans, Louisiana Heron, 22 Frazar Oyster Catcher, 44 Least Tern, Red-Backed Sandpiper, Western Sandpiper, (Kriot) 2 among flock of Red-backed Sandpipers, Hudsonian Curlew, Tule Yellowthroat, Barn Swallow, Ground Dove, Parrot 3, Ariz. Hooded Oriole, Wagler Oriole, Douglas Quail, Palmer Thrasher, Cardinal.
