Thank you for your time to visit and the coffee! Andrew and I arrived back to Denver to a very chilly rain. Next attempt at bullfrogs at the Museum may be this winter and so we'll try and meet up with you for supplies.

The bullfrogs all came from the main outdoor garden/ exhibit area (enclosed) at the Chiricahua Desert Museum in Rodeo, NM. We collected 106 on 9/29 and then 55 on 10/1. We started the massacre after dark (8:30p-9ish) and then continued until early morning 1-2am-ish. Method of euthanasia was with smacking them on rocks...since we're being technical here ;)
