Taxonomy

- Class- Magnoliopsida
 - Order- Myrales
 - Family- Ongraceae
 - Genus- Circaeа
 - Genus- Epilobium

Ongraceae

Evening Primrose

- Mostly Herbs, some shrubs
- Leaves- Simple, lacking stipules
- Flowers- Perfect, mostly actinomorphic
- Ovary Inferior
- Stamens 4-8
- Fruit- Long capsule



Circaea vs. *Epilobium*

CIRCAEA

EPILOBIUM

- Sepals and petals -2
- Stamens- 2
- Fruit-Indehiscent
Capsule

- Sepals and Petals- 4
- Stamens – 8
- Fruit- Dehiscent
Capsule

Epilobium

ANGUSTIFOLIUM

- Plant erect
- Many flowered
- Leaves
 - Lancolate
 - Glabrous
 - Underside veiny
- Style pubescent at base
- Stamens shorter than style (older plant)

LATIFOLIUM

- Plant decumbent
- Few flowered
- Leaves
 - Elliptic ovate- lancolate
 - Fine pubescence
 - Underside not veiny
- Style glabrous
- Stamens longer than style


